



Assumptions

- Unless noted, all passes are legal forward passes and all kicks are legal.
- Unless noted, plays do not involve the last timed down of a period.
- Unless noted, all kicks are untouched beyond the neutral zone or beyond the free-kick line.
- Unless noted, all penalties are accepted.
- Unless noted, all fouls are live-ball player fouls.
- Unless noted, plays do not result in a score.

1. Just after K1's punt is airborne and untouched by team R, K2 blocks R3. The contact causes R3 to knock the punter to the ground.
 - a. No problem.
 - b. R3 has fouled if K2's block was legal.
 - c. R3 has fouled if K2's block was illegal.
 - d. R3 has fouled under any circumstances.

2. Which of the following is not an option for team R when a free kick from team K's 40 yardline goes out of bounds untouched by team R?
 - a. A five-yard penalty enforced from the previous spot.
 - b. A new series at the yardline where the ball went out of bounds.
 - c. A new series after a five-yard penalty is enforced from the yardline where the ball went out of bounds.
 - d. A new series 25 yards in advance from the previous spot.

3. A1 is in possession of the ball beyond the line of scrimmage when B2 grabs the inside back collar of A1's shoulder pads or jersey and immediately pulls him toward the ground. Before A1 falls to the ground, he fumbles and B3 recovers.
 - a. No problem.
 - b. Foul on B2.

4. Second and 10 for team A from team B's 37 yardline. A1's legal forward pass is intercepted by B2 at his own three yardline. B2's momentum takes him into his own end zone. An official blows an inadvertent whistle.
 - a. Team A scores a safety.
 - b. Team B is awarded a touchback.
 - c. The momentum exception applies; team B will likely choose to begin a new series at its own three yardline.
 - d. B2 should ignore the whistle and continue playing.

5. Third and 27 for team A from its own 11 yardline. Quarterback A1 is under center when he takes the snap and throws a backward pass to fullback A2. Immediately upon receiving the pass, A2 gets off a quick kick. B3, who was blitzing on the play, takes three running steps and roughly knocks A2 to the ground.
 - a. No foul because team A was not in a scrimmage-kick formation.
 - b. No foul because A2 is by definition a back and not a kicker.
 - c. No foul because it wasn't reasonably certain a kick would be made.
 - d. B3 is guilty of running into the kicker.
 - e. B3 is guilty of roughing the kicker.

6. Second and 12 on team A's five yardline. Time for the first quarter expires during the down as quarterback A1 is sacked at his own two yardline. A3 is flagged for holding in the end zone.
 - a. If team B accepts the penalty, the period has ended.
 - b. If team B accepts the penalty, the period is extended for team A's free kick.

7. Fourth and 10 from team K's 20 yardline. K1's punt is blocked. The ball, which never crossed the neutral zone, rolls to team K's 10 yardline. K3 recovers the ball and punts it again from his own 10 yardline.
 - a. The ball is dead when K3 recovers it.
 - b. The ball remains live when K3 recovers it.

8. After the referee whistles the ready for team A's try, kicker A2 legally enters the field. However, A2 is not wearing a shoe on his kicking foot.

9. Team A moves to the line and all players are set. End A9 then slowly moves backward and continues moving backward as the ball is snapped. At the snap, A9 was in his backfield six yards behind his line.
 - a. Legal.

10. The umpire signals the game clock to stop because A1 is bleeding. Team A requests and is granted a charged timeout. During the timeout, A1 receives medical treatment and the wound is properly covered with a legal bandage.
- A1 need not leave the game.
 - A1 must sit out for at least one play.
11. Fourth and seven for team A from its own 45 yardline. B1 intercepts a pass at his own six yardline. After running a few steps, he is hit and fumbles at team B's three yardline. The ball rolls and hits the pylon, which is properly placed. As a result:
- The ball is returned to the spot of the fumble; it's team B's ball at its own three yardline.
 - It's a safety; team A scores two points.
 - It's a touchback; it's team B's ball at its own 20 yardline.
12. First and 10 for team A at its own 20 yardline. Quarterback A1 keeps the ball and is tackled by B5 at team A's 35 yardline. In trying to fend off the tackle A1 grasps but does not pull or twist B5's facemask.
- Legal play.
 - Facemask foul; team A is penalized 15 yards.
 - Facemask foul; team A is penalized five yards.
 - Facemask foul; team A is penalized five yards and loss of down.
13. First and 10 on team A's 26 yardline. Team A is in a formation with A1 directly behind the snapper seven yards behind the line. Immediately after the snap B3 charges directly at the snapper and contacts him by pushing him backward. A1 throws an incomplete pass.
- B3's action is legal.
 - B3's action is a foul; the penalty is 15 yards from the previous spot and an automatic first down.
 - B3's action is a foul; the penalty is 15 yards from the previous spot but not an automatic first down.
14. Team A has two timeouts remaining. With the clock running late in the first half substitute A12 runs from the team area onto the field and next to the line judge, who is standing between the sideline than the nine-yard marks. A12 requests a timeout. The timeout request:
- Is granted.
 - Is not granted until A12 is positioned between the nine-yard marks.
 - Is not granted until A12 is positioned between the hashmarks.
15. In the first possession of overtime, it is fourth down and 10 for team K from team R's 30 yardline. K1's untouched field goal attempt is short. The ball is rolling and is at team R's seven yardline when R5 touches the ball in an unsuccessful attempt to recover it. K9 recovers the ball at team R's three yardline. As a result:
- Team K's series is over; it's team R's ball.
 - Team K is awarded a new series at team R's 10 yardline.
 - Team K is awarded a new series at team R's 25 yardline.
 - Team K is awarded a new series at team R's three yardline.
 - Team K is awarded a new series at team R's seven yardline.
16. A double foul occurs when two or more live-ball fouls (other than nonplayer or unsportsmanlike) are committed by each team at such a time that the offended team is permitted a choice of penalties.
- True.

17. A fumble:
- Is the same as a muff.
 - May be recovered and advanced by any player at any time.
 - Occurs when a player loses possession of a live ball other than by handing, passing or legal kick.
18. Fourth and one for team A on team B's 17 yardline. Runner A1 is thrown for a three-yard loss. After the play B2 is flagged for a personal foul.
- It will be team A's ball first and goal on team B's 10 yardline.
 - It will be team B's ball first and 10 on team B's 35 yardline.
 - It will be team B's ball first and 20 on team B's 35 yardline.
 - It will be team B's ball first and 10 on team B's 10 yardline.
19. Team K's kick try passes completely between both uprights and completely above the crossbar and beyond it. A gust of wind then blows back the ball, which lands in the end zone after passing above the crossbar on its way back.
- The kick is no good.
 - The kick is good.
20. K1's free kick is muffed by R2 at team R's 35 yardline. K3 attempts to recover the loose ball but causes it to go out of bounds at team R's 30 yardline.
- That's a foul; team K has caused the kick to go out of bounds.
 - That's not a foul.

21. A legal forward pass has crossed the neutral zone when:
- Any part of the ball is beyond the neutral zone.
 - The ball strikes the ground any player an official or anything else beyond the line inbounds.
 - The entire ball is beyond the neutral zone.
22. Team A is granted a charged team timeout. After 20 seconds of the timeout have expired both teams are ready to resume play.

23. Fourth and seven for team K from team R's 30 yardline. K1's field goal attempt is blocked behind the line and recovered there by K9, who advances. As K9 crosses team B's five yardline, an official signals touchdown but does not blow his whistle. K9 continues over the goalline.
- Touchdown for team K.
 - The ball is dead when the official signals; it's first and goal for team K from team R's five yardline.
 - The ball should have been blown dead the moment K9 recovered it.
24. Following a touchback and before the ready for play team A elects to have the ball placed at the left hashmark. After the ready signal but before the snap B1 crosses the neutral zone and makes contact with A2. After the penalty is enforced:
- Team A may have the ball moved to the middle of the field for the next snap.
 - Team A may not have the ball moved to the middle of the field for the next snap.

 - The ball remains live when A2's helmet comes off.
26. Team A attempts a try with 7:23 to play in the first quarter. A1's legal forward pass is caught by A2 in the end zone. B3 is flagged for roughing the passer.
- Team A may have the penalty enforced on the succeeding kickoff.
 - The penalty is automatically declined.
27. Fourth and seven at team K's 27 yardline. Team K is lined up with the kicker 10 yards behind the line of the scrimmage and no player in position to receive a direct hand-to-hand snap. Immediately at the snap noseguard R7 contacts snapper K6. Punter K3 takes the snap, fakes a kick and runs. He is downed at team K's 30 yardline.
- R7 is not guilty of roughing the snapper because team K didn't kick.
 - R7 is guilty of roughing the snapper even though team K didn't kick.
28. Fourth and seven for team K from its own 20 yardline. K1's punt is a low line drive. R2, standing at team K's 24 yardline, leaps in an attempt to knock down the kick. He only succeeds in deflecting the ball, which hits the ground at team K's 27 yardline, where K3 falls on it.
- It's team R's ball at team K's 27 yardline.
 - It's team K's ball at team K's 27 yardline.
29. Team A has the ball first and 10 on its own 20 yardline. Quarterback A1 keeps the ball on an option play and is at team A's 23 yardline when he is hit and fumbles. The ball rolls out of bounds at team A's 25 yardline.
- It will be team A's ball second and seven on its 23 yardline.
 - It will be team A's ball second and five on its 25 yardline.
30. Spearing:
- Results in an automatic disqualification.
 - Involves any part of the helmet.
 - Involves the top of the helmet.
 - Can only be called against a defensive player.
31. K1's untouched free kick hits the ground at team R's three yardline midway between the hashmarks and the sideline. The ball rolls beyond the endline and is properly ruled a touchback.
- Team R has no choice; the ball will be spotted on team R's 20 yardline on the hashmark nearest where the ball first hit the ground.
 - The ball will be spotted on team R's 20 yardline anywhere between the hashmarks that team A chooses.
 - Team R has no choice; the ball will be spotted on team R's 20 yardline in the middle of the field.
32. Early in the game, A1 is disqualified for fighting. With four minutes left in the fourth period, A1 enters the game and throws a touchdown pass.

 - Kick-catching interference; team R may choose an awarded fair catch, the result of the play or have a 15-yard penalty enforced from the previous spot.
44. R1 muffs K2's punt beyond the neutral zone. While the ball is loose K3 uses his hands to block R4 in the back above the waist while attempting to recover the loose ball.
- Legal block since K3 is attempting to recover a loose ball.
 - Legal block since team R muffed the punt.
 - Legal block under any circumstances.
 - K3 is guilty of a block in the back.
 - K3 is guilty of clipping.
45. Team A goes on offense for its first series of overtime. The opponent scored a field goal on its first series to make the score 10-7. A1's pass is intercepted by B2, who advances to team B's 17 yardline, where he's hit and fumbles. A3 recovers at team B's 20 yardline.
- Team A will start a new series first and 10 at team B's 20 yardline.
 - The game is over; team B wins 10-7.
46. Fourth and 10 for team K from its own 30 yardline. R1 makes a fair catch of K2's punt near the sideline in front of team R's bench. Team R desires to have the ball placed in the center of the field for the next play.
- The request is denied.
 - The request is granted.
47. Fourth and 10 on team R's 17 yardline. K1's 34-yard field goal attempt is untouched and rolls to a stop on team R's one yardline. When no player from either team attempts to recover the ball, the official properly blows his whistle. It will be:
- R's ball on its one yardline.
 - R's ball on its 17 yardline.
 - R's ball on its 20 yardline.
 - R's ball on its 34 yardline.
48. Second and eight on team A's 30 yardline. A1's forward pass from his 20 yardline is tipped by B2 on team A's 24 yardline. The pass travels to team A's 35 yardline, where it is caught by A2, who advances to team A's 45 yardline. Before A1's pass left his hand tackle A7 wandered downfield to team A's 35 yardline but did not block beyond the neutral zone.

65. First and 10 on team A's 20 yardline. Quarterback A1 is flushed from the pocket and scrambles toward the sideline. As several team B players move in, A1 turns and, with an underhand motion, throws the ball backwards and out of bounds at team A's seven yardline.
- Legal play under any circumstance.
 - Legal play only because A1 threw the ball underhand rather than overhand.
 - Illegal pass.
66. A1's run results in a touchdown. During the run, B2 is flagged for grasping but not twisting A1's facemask.
- The penalty is automatically declined.
 - If team A accepts the penalty, it must be enforced from the succeeding spot.
 - If team A accepts the penalty, it must choose to have the penalty enforced on the subsequent kickoff.
 - If team A accepts the penalty, it may choose to have the penalty enforced on the subsequent kickoff or from the succeeding spot.
67. R1 gives a valid fair-catch signal at his 35 yardline. The ball bounces off his shoulder pad and is still in flight behind him.

 - Foul regardless if K1 was outside the tackle box when he kicked the ball.
